#### SUNDAY: Dubrovnik (D)

The ship is docked at Gruz harbor, approx. 3 Km from the old city. Boarding starts at 13:00, and due to many different flight arrivals, the first overnight stay will be in this port.

Dubrovnik can be easily explored on foot. Few urban experiences match strolling down the centuries-old promenade known as Stradun. More than an avenue, it is the city's main artery, lined with graceful stone palazzos where people work as well as live.

Guided sightseeing tours are highly recommended. Highlights include the Rector's Palace, the historic seat of government in medieval Dubrovnik; the Church of St. Blaise; the Franciscan Monastery with its 14th century pharmacy; the Dominican Monastery and the city's walls and gates.



#### Monday: Dubrovnik ► Korčula (B,L)

During breakfast we depart for Korčula, the birthplace of the great explorer Marco Polo followed by lunch on board while we cruise past the Korčula's stylish suburb Lumbarda. Upon arrival in port in the afternoon, you will be free to do your own sightseeing.

This island is home to a treasure trove of legends, tales and monuments. Be enthralled by the story of the ominous stone walls, which took over two centuries to build.

Overnight: at the port.



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### TUESDAY: Korcula ► Hvar (B,L)

Early in the morning we depart towards the little island Šćedro where we will have enough time to relax and refresh in the clean, crystal blue sea. Departure for Hvar after lunch. Hvar is the longest island in the Adriatic. Here we can find the Renaissance cathedral with its original tower, also the oldest community theatre in Europe, founded in 1612. City of Hvar offers many fine restaurants, bars and cafes that are open long into the night. Hvar is often referred to as the sunshine island.



### WEDNESDAY: Hvar ► Trstenik (B,L)

We sail from Hvar and cruise towards the little fishing and farming village of Trstenik on the Pelješac peninsula, where we will arrive after lunch. Swim in the afternoon and visit a winery. This is the area famous for its Dingac wine. Overnight in the port.



### THURSDAY: Trstenik ► Mljet (B,L)

Departing after breakfast on our way toward the island of Mljet, where we'll arrive after lunch and a swimming stop. The afternoon is free to enjoy exploring the National Park. Rent a small boat or bicycle to roam around the paths that surround the salt lake, an abbey and church lying on the islet.

We stay on the island for the night, at Polace or Pomena (photo: sunset at Pomena).



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#### FRIDAY: Mljet ► Sipan (B,L)

Early in the morning we continue our trip towards the Elafiti, a group of islands west of Dubrovnik, which attracts many tourists with their beautiful scenery and sandy beaches. Swimming and lunch is planned at one of the smaller islands, and we'll dock and stay for the night on largest one, Šipan.



#### SATURDAY: Sipan ► Dubrovnik (B,L)

Early departure for Dubrovnik, with breakfast en route. Enjoy in beautiful sights of nature along the way. Lunch on board and arrival at Dubrovnik's Gruz harbor early in the afternoon, approx. 14:00. The afternoon is free to further explore Dubrovnik or take an optional bus tour to Montenegro. Overnight in Gruz harbor (photo below).

#### SUNDAY: Dubrovnik (B)

Early breakfast, and it's time to say goodbye to the crew and all your new friends.
