(27.06) WEDNESDAY: Arrival at Zagreb (D)

Transfer from the airport to hotel. Check-in, afternoon at your leisure. Dinner at the hotel.

(28.06) THURSDAY : Zagreb (B)

The morning will be reserved for a guided walking tour of the historic Upper Town, where, among other sites, you will find St. Mark's Church, the Cathedral, the Government Palace and the Lotrscak tower. The rest of the day is at your leisure.



(29.06) FRIDAY: Zagreb ► Plitvice Lakes ► Opatija (B)

Bus to Plitvice, approx. 2.5 hrs.

Consisting of 16 lakes connected through a series of waterfalls, this is Croatia's oldest and most beautiful national park. Our guests will hike through the park, enjoy a boat ride over the emerald green lakes and take the street train back to the entrance. Plitvice Lakes was a popular shooting location in the 60s for Karl May's Winnetou movies. Walking shoes are essential. Bus to Opatija, approx. 2.5 hrs. Check-in your hotel for a free evening.



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(30.06) SATURDAY: Opatija ► Island of Krk (B,L)

Guided tour of Opatija in the morning, a place where the 19th Century elite spent winters: Wilhelm II, Franz Josef, Gustav Mahler, and Isadora Duncan. We will take a stroll along the boardwalk, visit parks and see the oldest hotel on the Adriatic coast -- an unforgettable trip to the *belle epoch*. Boarding the ship and departure from Opatija harbor at 13:00. After lunch we stop for a swim, then continue to the island of Krk, the largest island in the Adriatic. Krk is populated with a variety of large and small villages, surrounded by gentle green promenades and along the hidden bays and beaches. Rest of the day at leisure. We stay overnight in Krk.



(01.07) SUNDAY: Island of Krk ► Island of Rab (B,L)

After breakfast, we set sail to the Island of Rab (*Island of Love*) where you will do some sightseeing of the Rab town. Medieval walls, Romanesque church towers, churches and palaces, cobbled streets and ancient facades encircle Rab. Browse the streets and squares where many painters and artists exhibit their work. Overnight: Rab



(02.07) MONDAY: Island of Rab ► Zadar (B,L)

After breakfast we cruise from Rab along the island of Pag with a swim stop on tiny island Maun and continue towards Zadar in the afternoon. In the centuries past the Capital of Dalmatia, holds the oldest university in Croatia. Rich historical heritage is visible at every step: the Roman Forum, from the 1st century, basilica St. Donat, from the 9th century, and old city walls. The attractions are also the newly opened Museum of Ancient Glass, as well as the famous *Sea Organ* and *Greeting to the Sun*, both located on the city's waterfront. A guided sightseeing tour is organized for you. Overnight in Zadar.



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(01.07) TUESDAY: Zadar ► Kornati ► Vodice (B,L)

“On the last day of Creation, God desired to crown his work and thus created the Kornati Islands out of tears, stars and breath”, wrote Irish writer George Bernard Shaw. The beautiful nature, landscape, big and small islands (the old folk saying goes: One island for every day of the year) and the magnificent sea, all make the Kornati Islands a unique paradise. The area stretches between the islands of Dugi Otok and Pasman on the northwest to Zirje and Zlarin on the southeast. You'll sail today most of the length and make stops in the coves along for a swim and dock at Vodice for the night.



(04.07) WEDNESDAY: Vodice ► Krka Waterfalls ► Primosten (B,L,D)

Primosten is a small yet fascinating picturesque town that juts out into the sea and is known for its breathtaking nature and local wines. En route, enjoy the beautiful view of the Krka River Canyon. After lunch, do some sightseeing while enjoying the nature and waterfalls of the National Park rich with flora and fauna. Tonight we have Captain's dinner on board.

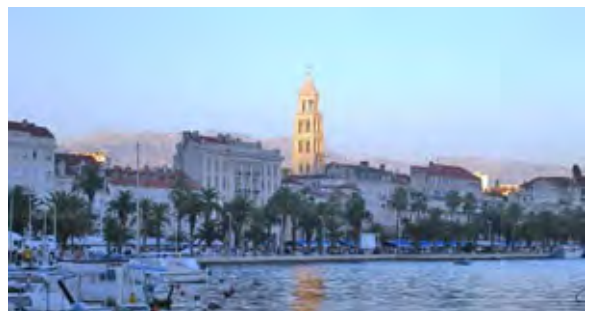
(05.07) THURSDAY: Primosten ► Trogir (B,L)

We head for "Little Venice", or the "floating museum" town as Trogir is often called. Located on a small island connected to the mainland and Ciovo peninsula by two bridges, the town is a magical place that offers plenty of cultural and historical monuments, charming small "konobas" (Croatian taverns) and restaurants that serve a variety of typical Dalmatian specialties. Overnight in Trogir.



(06.07) FRIDAY: Trogir ► Split (B,L)

Split is the economic and administrative hub of Dalmatia, with about 200,000 inhabitants. Many of Split's historical and cultural buildings can be found within the walls of Diocletian's Palace. In addition, the National Theatre, old churches and museums in the Split region make it an important cultural attraction. A walking sightseeing tour of the Dioclecian Palace is arranged. Overnight in Split.



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(07.07) SATURDAY: Split ► Makarska (B,D)

You'll be at liberty to discover Split on your own in the morning. Meantime the crew will have a chance to freshen up the ship and restock, or it may be necessary to change ships, same "A+" category, at same terminal. Departure from the harbor at 13:00. Enjoy an afternoon swim at one of the beaches on the riviera, where we'll have an early dinner (BBQ) to get to know any new fellow passengers or crewmembers that arrived onboard in Split. Those who feel adventurous may like to join our rafting excursion on the Cetina River, and rejoin the ship at Makarska in the evening. Overnight in Makarska.



(08.07) SUNDAY: Makarska ► Island of Mljet (B,L)

Early morning departure from Makarska towards Mljet, with the first stop at the Peljesac peninsula for a refreshing swim. The afternoon is free to enjoy the peaceful Mljet exploring its National Park with a salt lake and an abbey and church lying on a islet.

Overnight in Polaca or Pomena port.



(09.07) MONDAY: Island of Mljet ► Dubrovnik (B,L)

After breakfast, the ship departs for Dubrovnik, the highlight point of this cruise. There will be a short stop en route for a quick swim. Upon arrival at Dubrovnik's Gruz harbor in the afternoon, a local guide will await to take you for a sightseeing tour, stopping at the city's main historical sites. You'll have enough free time for a walk on your own along the *Stradun* and city walls - do some shopping and find a fine restaurant. Overnight in the port.



(10.07) TUESDAY: Dubrovnik ► Sipan or Trstenik (B,L,D)

Morning is free for you to enjoy another stroll around this beautiful city, before sailing at noon towards the Sipan on the island of Sipan or further north to Trstenik on the Peljesac peninsula, depending on the weather and situation in ports. There will be an opportunity for a swim and a visit to a local winery. Tonight is Captain's Dinner, serving grilled fresh local seafood. Overnight in port.

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(11.07) WEDNESDAY: Sipan or Trstenik ► Korcula (B,L)

After breakfast the ship sets sail for Korcula, the birthplace of Marco Polo. Lunch on board today will be served at anchor in front of Korcula's exclusive Lumbarda village. The vessel will then dock at Korcula harbor for the rest of the day and night. A guided tour is provided; in this old town you can find more legends and tales than anywhere else. A guided tour is included.

Overnight in Korcula.



(12.07) THURSDAY: Korcula ► Hvar (B,L)

Sailing early in the morning for the Pakleni Islands for lunch and a swim, just in front of the Hvar harbor. Then Hvar, another old town, with a renaissance cathedral, the oldest community theatre in Europe - founded in 1612, yet very fashionable tourist destination, offering abundant entertainment, shopping and fine restaurants. A guided tour is included.

Overnight in Hvar.



(13.07) FRIDAY: Hvar ► Bol ► Split (B,L)

Our next stop will be Bol on the island of Brac and a visit to its famous beach Zlatni Rat (the Golden Cape) -- the gravel promontory shifts from side to side as the wind and waves change its shape. Bol is a typical fisherman's town turned into a popular tourist destination. After lunch we will start our journey back to Split, make a stop along the way for another swim, before approaching the Split Riviera and arrival in late afternoon.

Overnight alongside in Split's harbor.



(14.07) SATURDAY: Split departure (B)

Early breakfast after which it is time to say goodbye to the crew and all your new friends (Breakfast box in case of early flight departure). Transfer to the Split Airport. And we hope to see you again on Croatian Coastal Cruises.
