SATURDAY: Opatija ► Island of Krk (B,L)

19th Century elites used to spend winters in Opatija. Wilhelm II, Franz Josef, Gustav Mahler, Isadora Duncan ... Take a stroll along the boardwalk, visit parks and see the oldest hotel on the Adriatic coast -- an unforgettable trip to the *belle epoch*. Boarding the ship starts at 11 AM, departure follows at 1 PM. After lunch we stop for a swim, then sail to the town of Krk on the Krk Island, the largest in the Adriatic. The town is surrounded by gentle green promenades along the hidden bays and beaches. As the ship docks, the rest of the day is at leisure. We stay alongside overnight.



SUNDAY: Island of Krk ► Island of Rab (B,L)

After breakfast, we set sail to the Island of Rab (*Island of Love*) where you will do some sightseeing of the Rab town. Medieval walls, Romanesque church towers, churches and palaces, cobbled streets and ancient facades encircle Rab. Browse the streets and squares where many painters and artists exhibit their work. Overnight: Rab



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MONDAY: Island of Rab ► Zadar (B,L)

After breakfast we cruise from Rab along the island of Pag with a swim stop and continue towards Zadar in the afternoon. Zadar's old town is a destination in itself, with a Roman forum, some beautiful medieval churches and a warren of cobbled streets lined with Venetian-era town houses, all sitting compact on a car-free peninsula. Close to the tip of the peninsula, be sure to check out two contemporary sound and light installations, the Sea Organ and Greeting to the Sun. Overnight in Zadar.



TUESDAY: Zadar ► Island of Molat or Olib (B,L,D)

Early departure for the island of Molat or Olib, depending on how busy the harbors are at these two islands. Tucked in the northern part of Zadar's archipelago, Molat boasts very little infrastructure, guaranteeing a very quiet and peaceful stay -- a nice break from busy tourist spots elsewhere. Like Molat, Olib is known for its tranquility -- where you can rest your body and soul, a place absent of cars and trucks, with the exception of a tractor or two to support its agriculture. Tonight is Captain's dinner on board, serving grilled fresh local seafood.

Overnight in one or the other port.

Passenger Comment: Not far after the entrance to the Kornati Islands is Molat Island, a sleepy port with a small village attached. There were a few restaurants on the port that did a nice business with the boats tied up outside. The cruise through the Kornati Islands National Park was, perhaps, the highlight of our trip. The ghostly islands silhouetted against the sea and sky was simply magical. The sea seemed to have carved a face out of this slab of rock (photo on the right).



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WEDNESDAY: Island of Molat or Olib ► Ilovik ► Island of Losinj (B,L)

After breakfast, we set sail to the peaceful Ilovik, called *Island of Flowers*, for a relaxing swim. While lunching on route, we head for Mali Lošinj, which is one of the most popular islands on the northern Adriatic due to abundance of pine trees and clear waters. Take a walk along the harbour, go for a dip at night at Cikat beach, or visit the picturesque town of Veli Lošinj (5 km away).

Island Fact: Mali Lošinj is among sunniest places in Europe. It's a big favourite with Italian tourists coming just across the border.



THURSDAY: Island of Losinj ► Island of Cres (B,L)

After a morning swim we leave for the island of Cres, a long and narrow island covered with oak, beach and pine forests as well as vineyards and olive tree plantations. Overnight in Cres.

Passenger Comment: We were very lucky in enjoying beautiful summer days for the duration of the cruise but today our luck ran out. A storm moved in quickly, ruining our chances of a morning swim. Cres town harbor enjoyed this bit of light before the rain started crashing down.



FRIDAY: Island of Cres ► Opatija (B,L)

After breakfast we leave for Opatija, with a late afternoon arrival. On route, you will have the opportunity to enjoy the beautiful view of the famous Opatija Riviera. For your last night on the ship we recommend a farewell party, a perfect time to exchange addresses with your fellow passengers! A stroll along the famous *Lungo Mare* pathway takes you to the fisherman village Volosko, well known for good seafood restaurants.

SATURDAY: Opatija ► (B) & end of the cruise

Breakfast, and it's time to say goodbye.

WEDNESDAY: Arrival at Zagreb (D)

Transfer from the airport to hotel. Check-in, afternoon at your leisure. Dinner at the hotel.

THURSDAY : Zagreb (B)

The morning will be reserved for a guided walking tour of the historic Upper Town, where, among other sites, you will find St. Mark's Church, the Cathedral, the Government Palace and the Lotrscak tower. The rest of the day is at your leisure.



FRIDAY: Zagreb ► Plitvice Lakes ► Opatija (B)

Bus trip to Plitvice, approx. 2.5 hrs.

Consisting of 16 lakes connected through a series of waterfalls, this is Croatia's oldest and most beautiful national park.

Trivia: Plitvice Lakes was a popular shooting location in the 60s for Karl May's Winnetou movies.

Our guests will hike through the park, enjoy a boat ride over the emerald green Kozjak Lake and take the street train back to the entrance. Stay time at park: 3 hours (walking shoes are essential).

Bus trip to Opatija, approx. 2.5 hrs. Check-in your hotel for a free evening.

Optional:

- Supplement for full board EUR 110 per person per week, minimum 10 passengers required.
- Drink supplement: EUR 16 per week - includes choice of one glass of wine, beer or soft drink with lunch.
- Bottled water: EUR 20 per person per week - includes 1,5 liter per person per day (to be paid on the spot)
- English breakfast supplement: EUR 40 per person, per week - incl. 2 eggs, bacon, tomato and mushrooms, or fruit & yoghurt, or similar. (For continental breakfast, included in the fare, the following is served: coffee, tea, milk, glass of juice, cereal, bread, a variety of spreads - butter, honey, jam, soft cheese; daily additions such as ham and cheese or boiled eggs, frankfurters, salami etc.)
- Wedding renewal package: EUR 100 per couple - includes wedding vows renewal ceremony performed by the Captain, certificate, a bottle of champagne and a memento.
