SATURDAY: Split ► Omis or Pucisca (L)

We'll depart from Split harbor at 13:00. Cruising through the Strait of Brac we'll host a BBQ on board to get you acquainted with your crew and fellow passengers. Depending on weather, the Captain will choose our first destination, Omiš or Pučišća.

Steep rocky mountain cliffs at the confluence of River Cetina and Adriatic Sea surround Omiš. Here you can go white water rafting on the streams of the river, climb an old fortress above the town, play volleyball on the beach or visit the town's historical sites.





Pučišća is located on the northern side of the Island of Brač, hidden in a the deep bay, and is the home to one of the very few stone masonry schools and workshops left in Europe, which we may visit. Marvel over the town's pristine sea and splendid nature while indulging over a delectable meal only this town can offer.

Town fact: Brac stone was used to build the limestone columns of the White House in Washington DC, the Diocletian palace in Split, the foundations of many buildings in Venice, and many more famous buildings.

Overnight in one of these two towns.

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SUNDAY: ► Korcula (B,L)

By the time you reach the deck in the morning, Omiš/Pučišća will already be behind us. After a morning swim in the crystal blue sea, we cruise toward Korčula; the birthplace of the famous explorer Marco Polo. Lunch will be served either on the tip of the Peljesac peninsula (near Lovište) or in the quiet bay of Kneža on Korčula Island. Afternoon is all yours for sightseeing of Korcula City. According to the legend, Korčula was found by Trojan hero Anthenor in the 12th century BC. On

this island you can find more legends, tales and



monuments than anywhere else. In the evening we recommend a visit to one of numerous *konobas* or enjoy the views of the main land from one of the numerous cafes and bars.

Monday: ► Lastovo (B,L)



As a prelude to more cruising we suggest a short walk through the open market in Korčula where you can buy fresh fruit to enjoy during the day. We continue our cruise towards Lastovo, the furthest, inhabited island in Dalmatia, which Romans called the Imperial Island. Docked in port of Ubli, one has the opportunity to visit protected Park of nature and enjoy in the virgin nature or visit the town of Lastovo, known for many little churches and unusually shaped chimneys. Smaller islands, with plenty of bays suitable for snorkelling, surround the island. Overnight in Ubli, Lastovo.

TUESDAY: ► Vis (B,L)

Early in the morning we depart toward island of Vis, which used to be a strategic isolated harbor for the navy. Thus it has a well-preserved charm of the old Mediterranean, the Mediterranean as it used to be. The town was developed near the remains of the ancient Issa, first urban centre in Croatia, formed by the Greeks in 4th century B.C. Near Vis is a little island Ravnik and its Green Cave. We'll visit this island or Komiza town depending on the weather.



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WEDNESDAY: ► Bisevo ► Starigrad (B,L)



Early in the morning we sail towards the little island of Biševo to visit its Blue Cave, beautiful natural phenomenon, which is worth visiting only on a sunny day and calm seas, so weather permitting. Then we continue sailing towards Starigrad on the island of Hvar. Free afternoon to explore this old town. The famous Stari Grad Field is the oldest in Croatia and the best-preserved example of ancient Greek system of agriculture, which, together with the old town, is part of World Heritage, protected by UNESCO.

THURSDAY: ▶ Bol (B,L)

After breakfast we cruise towards the Bol town on the island of Brač. Swimming is planned at the famous Zlatni Rat, i.e. Golden Cape, beach - its promontory shifts from side to side as the wind and waves shape it. Bol is a typical fishermen town turned into a popular tourist destination. Here we spend the night and have the opportunity to enjoy excellent fresh fish, local wines and other delicacies of this unique island, enjoy a walk along the promenade. Overnight in Bol.



FRIDAY: ► Split (B,L)

The last day we spend mostly relaxing and swimming in quiet bays along the coast of island of Brač. And we arrive at Split in the afternoon, for you to further explore this beautiful old city - there may be a possibility of joining our guided tour of the old town (Diocletian's palace) with an English speaking quide. Overnight alongside in Split's harbor.

SATURDAY: Split departure (B)

Early breakfast, and it's time to say goodbye to the crew and all your new friends.

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
